F1 - And Off to School We Go...

While we have begun to change parenting and therapeutic approaches for children who have attachment and trauma issues, we have not addressed these issues in a school setting. Understanding dysregulation and using specific learning strategies in a school setting can increase the child's sense of safety and eventually improve learning. This session will address the impact trauma has on a child's ability to learn, classroom strategies for disruptive times as well as information about IEP's. *Trainer: Mary McGowan* (Approved for CEUs)
